reminder... Residents must be current with your dues. Call the Clubhouse Manager, Ashley Williams to confirm if your event date is available. Complete the Clubhouse Rental Application along with your \$200 check for personal use or \$300 check for business. All requests should be made at least 2 weeks in advance of your event unless it is an emergency request. The clubhouse rental **does not** include use of the pool. Applications for Architectural Changes. Applications are available in the hallway of the Clubhouse. Jerry Wheeler is the approval authority for all architectural requests. Please remember as you advance with repairs caused by Hurricane Helene, fences can only be 6 feet tall. Eight-foot fences are not permitted per neighborhood covenants AND Richmond County.

Parking: Please remember that our streets are narrow and if you park on the street for a lengthy time, you are limiting the flow of all traffic, emergency vehicles and delivery trucks. Overnight parking on the street is not permitted. And finally, parking on the grass is not permitted according to our covenants.

<u>Neighborhood Road Repair:</u>

Thanks to concerned neighbors and board members who were persistent in calling and writing to city engineering and Commissioner Rice to repair possible sink holes in our neighborhood. The repairs were made on the corner of Larchmont/Hillcreek and Chaucer/Weyhill!!!



<u>Turf:</u>

- Plant grass where needed
- Fertilize lawns if needed
- Apply second application of pre-emergence herbicide for crabgrass and broad leaf weed control.
- Check lawn for disease and insect damage
- Treat for mole crickets in late June to July
- Scout for cinch bugs in St. Augustine lawns

Flowers:

- Fertilize Roses
- Spray roses for insect and disease control
- Plant marigolds, zinnias, salvia, annual vinca, begonias and dahlias.
- Pinch terminals of flowers to promote branching
